


PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Dear Parishioners.

Is Jesus welcome in your house? You may be thinking, "Is this a trick question?" Well, the question is straightforward. And there is no trick answer. The problem is that, according to today's gospel reading from Mark 6:1-6, Jesus was not too welcome in his own house!

I am sure things were more than OK when Jesus was growing up. However, after he was baptized by John in the Jordan River and began his public ministry, Jesus was different. He worked miracles, taught with authority, formed disciples, and angered the religious authorities. Jesus was somewhat of a polarizing figure. His own extended family did not know what to make of him.

I hope that Jesus is welcome in each of our families. He does not have to be a polarizing figure for us. However, having Jesus in your family does mean that He will be the head of the household. And each member of the family is set on pleasing Him first. Just what does that mean?

I believe that begins with marriage itself. Jesus did his first miracle at a wedding reception. He spoke of the Kingdom as a wedding banquet. He gave very clear teaching on the permanence of marriage. As the Church reflected on these and other thoughts, it discerned that the vocation of marriage is a sacrament - an outward sign instituted by Christ that gives grace. So, welcoming Jesus into our homes begins with sacramental marriages.

An article I read a number of years ago said, "Good news! Divorce is down! Bad news! So is marriage!" Many couples are foregoing marriage or opting for destination marriages that are sentimental, but not sacramental. One of the things that has encouraged me this year is the number of couples having their marriages sacramentalized. After some paperwork and preparation, I have blessed around six marriages in the last six months. A number of these marriages had previous marriages that needed annulments. We were able to work through those issues also. I praise God for these couples welcoming Jesus into the home!

However, a sacramental marriage is just a beginning. Jesus in the home means making sure the rest of the family is connected with Jesus.

Again, over the last year I have witnessed at least a dozen school age children be baptized in our parishes. Some went on to make their first Holy Communion and Confirmation. Again, these are big steps in welcoming Jesus into the home.

Welcoming Jesus into the home also means coming to His house every week. As the Servant of God, Fr. Peyton, said over sixty years ago, the family that prays together, stays together. Prayer at Mass is the cornerstone of Catholic life for individuals and especially for families.

There are other things that are key to welcoming Jesus into your homes. One of those things is religious education. Formal religious education will never outweigh the influence of parents living their faith, bringing the children to Mass, and talking about Jesus at home. However, formal, and intentional religious education is an important element to inviting Jesus into your home. There are three forms in which this intentional, formal religious education can take place. One way is through a Catholic school. Recently, the Diocese of Cleveland has clustered parishes and schools for the Keeping the Faith initiative. We will hear more about this in the coming year. St. Julie Parish and St. Peter Parish have been

paired up. And the option for a Catholic elementary education for our parishes is St. Peter School.

Mr. Brooks (who grew up in St. Julie Parish), and is the principal of St. Peter's School, is inviting parents to schedule a tour of our school. He does give a disclaimer. Summertime renovations make the school's appearance a bit shabby. (By the first day, things will be back in order).

The two other forms of religious education are first, the PSR program. Please check out the St. Julie PSR website. Or you may simply contact Kelly Reed who oversees the program. The third form is intentional homeschooling for religious education. Please contact me or Kelly if you are considering doing this. We need to approve your plan. (As an aside: sign your children up or volunteer to assist at Vacation Bible School - take the plunge and check out Scubal All are welcome!)

So, I strongly encourage you to invite Jesus into your home. Again, where he is welcome, he does not polarize. In fact, just the opposite happens. Jesus heals and unites. He is the heart of the Holy Family, with Mary and Joseph. Jesus is about making our families holy too. And not just holy. He is the source of wholesomeness and happiness. Jesus, the fullness of God's love in human form, teaches us to love sacrificially - first by respecting ourselves and other family members, then by serving them. Let us not be afraid to let Jesus be head of our homes.


