Dear Parishioners,

October began with blessings. Both St. Peter and St. Julie parishes had animal and pet blessings last weekend. St. Julie Parish gathered at the St. Francis of Assisi shrine on Julie Lane on Saturday, the feast day of St. Francis. St. Peter Parish gathered at the playground on Sunday morning between Masses. The Book of Blessings reminds us that animals not only serve in a functional way (for police departments or other services), but also as pets who bring comfort and companionship. May "All creatures of our God and King" give praise to God.

Let us keep Fr. Isidore in our prayers as he heads out to Our Lady of Gethsemane Monastery in Kentucky this week. He will be on retreat with the monks for five days. May the Lord refresh and bless him!

Our first reading this week focuses on Naaman, a Syrian general, who came to Israel seeking to be healed of leprosy. He reluctantly plunged into the muddy waters of the Jordan River at the bidding of the prophet Elisha. Much to his surprise, he was healed. Naaman tried to give Elisha a gift. When he refused, Naaman thought of a way to express his gratitude to God for his healing. He would take earth from the Holy Land back to Syria. On that earth, he would worship the God of Israel.

Our gospel reading is a bit more familiar. When ten lepers besought Jesus for healing, he sent them to the priests. While on the way to see the priests, they were healed. A Samaritan returned, praising God and thanking Jesus. After pondering where the other nine were, Jesus addressed the Samaritan. "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Naaman the Syrian and Samaritan point the way for us. For sure, they were grateful that they were healed. However, their gratitude brought them to acknowledge the living God. They were not only grateful for the gift. They humbled themselves before the Giver, God, and gave him thanks. This kind of gratitude, coupled with humility, leads to salvation.

I think of the old Godspell song, Day by Day. Its lyrics are: To see Thee more clearly, love Thee more dearly, follow Thee more nearly, day by day. To see the blessings of God more clearly and respond with gratitude...to be impelled to express love for the Lord in an unashamed manner...to follow his ways more nearly: this is our life! This is what Naaman the Syrian and healed Samaritan did. May they inspire us to not only be grateful for our gifts but love the Giver and follow his ways more wholeheartedly.

Week 3 Update

As we pray for an end to abortion, we also need to pray for those who have experienced abortion. "Deborah" tells her story:

I had an abortion because I was nervous about being pregnant at 17, single, and because my boyfriend wanted me to have one. When I went to Planned Parenthood, the worker there told me that I wouldn't be aborting a baby, because it was nothing more than a blob of cells. She then told me that I would have to forget about school if I decided not to have an abortion. I scheduled the appointment. Because it was against the law in 1975 for a minor to get an abortion without parental consent, the woman from Planned Parenthood told me to bring a legal ID from someone else, and not to tell my parents. A couple of years later, I was in the same situation, and had gotten another abortion.

As time went on after the abortions, I tried to hide my shame. There were physical aspects from the abortion that were bothersome, but nothing like the shame from having an abortion, and the guilt for both the abortion, and the lies I had to tell to get it. Years later, thoughts of that day kept coming back to me – over and over again. I realized that I had done the most awful thing I could ever do, and in the most inhumane way - I paid someone to kill my unborn baby. After that, I felt that I should suffer. I felt cheap and unworthy. I used sex for recreation; I used abortion for birth control.

A friend of mine told me about the after-care abortion recovery program at Rachel's Vineyard, where I found healing. Even though I didn't think that I was worthy of God's forgiveness for this, the pain was too much, and I decided to go to Him, anyway. God's love and forgiveness came, and eventually the images stopped. A friend brought me to the Lord, and I accepted Christ as my Savior. When God forgave me, he turned the situation into something good. He made me realize that I could help others who could have to make the same choice I had, or those who have experienced the pain & suffering after an abortion as I have. This is why I am silent no more.

Meet at the St. Julie large parking lot at 11:15am.

Also, on Thursdays from 12noon to 1pm, a Rosary Hour for Life will be held at St. Julie Billiart in the church. Join with fellow parishioners in the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle to pray for an end to abortion in conjunction with the ongoing Prayer Vigil at the abortion facility.

Another great opportunity for prayer is each Wednesday, the St. Julie Billiart Rosary Group will pray the Rosary at the church in the St. Anne Room <u>at 1pm</u> followed by Eucharistic Adoration at the church from 2-5pm.

Each Monday, St. Peter Parish participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm. Those going to the Preterm abortion facility leave at 11:15 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot and return at 1:45 PM. Those praying at St Peter Church meet at the church at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.
