



From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

On July 3 Gov. DeWine signed into law the State of Ohio Budget. One of the things that makes this budget different is that it significantly increased the amount money of available for private education grades K through 12. My point in mentioning this in my column this week is simple. If you have considered Catholic education for your elementary school children but were hesitant because of the cost, please contact the St. Peter school office and leave a message. You may be able to send your children to St. Peter School at a significantly lower cost or even tuition free. It cannot hurt to inquire.

I do not watch much TV. However, I do get around town, read the Elyria Chronicle and receive mail. Issue 1 is a hot topic. Much of it focuses on the effect it will have in the November election. I personally am for Issue 1. Most states have a 60% or higher threshold to amend their constitutions. Ohio had that provision for over 100 years. It has only been since 1912 that Ohio has had a 50% plus one vote to change its constitution. Ironically, most of the groups that desire the defeat of Issue 1 have constitutions that govern their organizations (such as the ACLU, Planned Parenthood and others.) All of them require 60-75% of their constituency to change their own constitutions or governing documents. However, for the State of Ohio they want 50% plus one! In my opinion, constitutions ought not be changed willy-nilly. Let the legislature do its job. If we do not like the job they are doing, we can vote them out.

The readings this week call us to treasure our faith. One person stumbled upon a treasure in a field. Another person searched long and hard until they found the pearl of great price. These are two paths. However, their response was similar. They joyfully sold all and made their purchases. These two purchasers give us an example. We must never fear investing ourselves in the Lord and his work. CS Lewis discovered this when, like a cornered animal, he finally acknowledged that God existed. He did so fearing that life as he knew it was over. Instead, he found himself *Surprised by Joy*. That phrase became the title of his autobiography. It also captures the reality of what happens when we surrender to the Lord. We experience joy.

Here are some opportunities to invest in the work of the Lord right here at St. Julie Parish. We need more people to be a:

- Sacristan: This involves coming early and setting up for Mass, cleaning up after Mass and sometimes setting up for the upcoming Mass. Training and mentoring will be available for all who want to assist the parish in this way.
- 2. Ushers: This involves coming to Mass a bit earlier, greeting people, finding someone to bring up the gifts during the offertory of the Mass, taking up the collection at the appropriate time and greeting people as they leave. Again, training is available.
- 3. **Servers**: Like the other two positions, it involves arriving early, setting up for Mass, serving at the Mass and assisting in bringing the vessels back to the sacristy.
- 4. **Money Counters**: Like the job title says, it involves counting the collections after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and through the 11:00 a.m. Mass. There are some other duties.

Each of these opportunities are ways that you can give back to St. Julie Parish for bringing you the Lord Jesus! For each of these service opportunities, St. Julie Parish will provide training. You will be well equipped to succeed! Thank you and please call the office and we will get you plugged in.

Vote to Protect Life: Groups outside of Ohio are attempting to push through a proposed amendment to Ohio's constitution in November, which would eliminate parental consent in abortion decisions for minors, make abortion available for all nine months of pregnancy, and force Pro-Life groups to refer people for abortions. There is a special election on August 8 (Issue 1) which raises the threshold for changing our state constitution from 50% plus 1 vote to a 60% vote of the electorate. Making this change to the constitutional process in Ohio will help make the process more robust for changing our state constitution. A "Yes" vote on Issue 1 in August would make it more difficult for the anti-life, anti-family amendment to pass in November. Let us vote to protect both child and mother in all elections.
