


PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Dear Parishioners.

Walking with Moms in Need is a wonderful initiative to do exactly what the title says. This joint venture between St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes will help pregnant women with just about any need they might have. Women who have an unplanned pregnancy might have social needs (like someone to talk to), material needs (shelter, furniture, food, whatever) or medical needs (pre and postnatal care). Walking with Moms in Need is preparing a team of people who can assist women in any of these situations. There are more details on the training session this Sunday, January 21 at St. Julie Parish in this bulletin. Please consider joining this worthwhile ministry for moms in need.

The last two years have been a roller coaster ride for Pro-Lifers in Ohio. In June of 2022, the Supreme Court of the United States overturned Roe vs. Wade. However, 17 months later, the citizens of Ohio passed a constitutional amendment that protected, not the unborn, but abortion rights throughout the whole of a pregnancy. What is our response now?

First, we do not yield to frustration, despair, or apathy. Instead, we do these three things:

- We pray. We do this in our personal prayers and by our corporate prayers. One way will be to join together for a Holy Hour at St. Peter Parish this Sunday at 7:00 p.m. We must continue to intercede for the unborn and their parents.
- We serve. This is the beauty of the Walking with Moms in Need initiative. Again, check out the information in this week's bulletin.
- We educate. This begins with us. The better we understand why we are Pro-Life, the stronger we will be to resist the cultural narrative that pits a woman against her baby. We will also be more able to help other people understand why protecting the unborn and helping their mothers really matter.

Christian Unity was one of the hopes of Vatican II.

Immediately after the Council, there was a fair amount of ecumenical dialogue (respectful dialogues among church leaders that sought to understand other Christians and work toward resolving differences) taking place. However, these formal attempts to reunite Christians waned. On a formal level, there is not much happening.

However, as the influence of Christian values becomes more and more bleached out of our culture, Christians of other traditions, as well as Catholics, have informally met to pray, read Sacred Scripture and seek to encourage one another. This is a good thing.

We are currently in the middle of Prayer for Christian Unity Week (January 17-25). We join our prayers to that of our Lord Jesus Christ, who on the eve of his death prayed, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father are in me and I in

you...(John 17:20-21a) Let us pray that the love of Christ would impel us to love one another more deeply and inspire greater unity in Him who is the Truth.

Next Sunday begins Catholic
Schools Week. There has never been a
better time to put your children in
Catholic School. I believe our priorities
are right on target: Faith, Academics, and
Everything Else. Also, there is more
money available to assist with tuition
(through the State of Ohio and other
sources) than ever before. I encourage
you to look into St. Peter School. Open
