

Dear Parishioners

I write you from Assisi, Italy on Monday, October 27. We have been to Rome, Montecassino, San Giovanni Rotondo, Lanciano and Loreto before coming to Assisi. I hope to give a presentation that will cover our whole journey sometime after our return. However, I will share some thoughts about our visit to Assisi.

Assisi is the hometown of St. Francis and St. Clare. The earthly remains of St. Carlo Acutis are also housed in Assisi at St. Maria Maggiore Church. Our day began with Mass in the Basilica of St. Francis, a five-minute walk from our hotel. We were able to briefly visit the tomb of St. Francis and then took a leisurely (though hilly) walk to St. Maria Maggiore to pray before the tomb of St. Carlo. From there we pressed on to the Basilica of St. Clare and prayed before her tomb.

After some free time for lunch, shopping and exploring, our group took a short bus ride to the Papal Basilica of Our Lady of the Angels, within sight of medieval part of Assisi. Within this large basilica is a small chapel called the *Porziuncola*.

Those were the places we visited today. If I were to make this a spiritual travelogue, I would begin in a side chapel in the Basilica of St. Clare. This is where the San Damiano Cross hangs today. From this cross, Francis heard the Lord say to him, Francis, Francis, go and rebuild My Church, which you see falling into ruins. Francis took this quite literally. He and his companions began to rebuild the small church outside of Assisi called Our Lady of the Angels. Francis called this neglected church the Porziuncola, which means "little portion."

This "Little Portion" became home base for the Franciscans. Francis and his disciples began praying together, learning together, and eventually began to realize that they were to do more than rebuild a building. They were to spiritually renew the Church. They began to preach repentance and call people to follow Jesus Christ in a radical way. Though Francis traveled throughout Italy and beyond, he would die near the Portziuncola at the age of 44 on October 3, 1226.

When Clare of Assisi heard of what St. Francis was doing, she wanted to embrace this radical lifestyle. On the evening of Palm Sunday, March 20, 1212, with the consent of her bishop, Clare left her father's house with her aunt Bianca and another companion and met Francis at the Portziuncola. Francis cut her hair as a sign of following only God's will. She exchanged her rich gown for a simple robe and a veil. Thus, the second order of Francis, the Poor Clares, had its beginnings.

Though Carlo had the normal interests of a young man of his time (soccer and video games), those interests paled in comparison to his faith. He was a programming whiz and by the age of 15 had developed a website on Eucharistic miracles (our pilgrimage visited one of these at Lanciano) that chronicled these events. It is in 17 languages. At the age of 15 Carlo contracted a rare, aggressive, and fatal form of leukemia and died within a month on October 12, 2006. Pope Leo XIV canonized St. Carlo Acutis on September 7, 2025.

Our pilgrimage group was able to breathe in the lives of these saints in an inspiring way today. I pray that we can live the faith we share with them with new ardor and joy.
