From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

So often in today's news sources, we hear about the negative side of life... the things that sell papers. And yet, if we search closely enough - in the smaller headlines - there are reports of the positive... events, and people that tell the story of human compassion, love and forgiveness. Into which category of 'news' do each of us fall? Do we relay the negative or the positive? Do we aim to hurt or to help?

Jesus' command to the crowd and to His disciples is bold and direct: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." This statement comes on the heels of Peter's remarks that Jesus should not have to suffer and die as He had indicated to them. Peter didn't want to hear the negative... but Peter also did not understand what resurrection would be. Sorting out the news and messages needs to be filtered through eyes and ears of faith.

Give it a thought: The last time that you corrected someone, was it done with charity or in malice? Even with parents to children or children toward parents, how could you have communicated the same message with greater patience, understanding or love? Shouting or demanding with a raised voice may not be the best approach. Incorporating our faith into daily events can strengthen and encourage one and other. This week, try to find ways to highlight the positive and weave God's hope, mercy and forgiveness into the fabric of your life.

In addition, keeping the words of Sacred Scripture close to our hearts, we are reminded to not only pray for those who have offended us but also for those we have offended. The Lord's Prayer is the perfect prayer for today... to forgive as God forgives. Pray it and pray it often as today... We Remember! By your efforts - no matter how large or small - let us make a difference for a better world.
