Dear Parishioners.

I am writing this column just as the polls for the election are closing on Tuesday evening. So, without knowing who the next president will be, I want to share with some thoughts about going forward. Without knowing who will be sitting in the Oval Office, I do know that his or her job will be difficult. So, the first order of business will be for all Christians is to pray for that person and their administration. St. Paul put it this way in the first century: First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity. This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth (1 Timothy 2:1-4)

A close second to prayer is love. As I mentioned in my homilies (a daily Mass and at St. Julie's last weekend), For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens (Ephesians 6:12). In other words, our enemy is the devil and his minions, not our neighbor who has differing political views than we do. That person we must respect and love, whether our good will is returned or not.

Thirdly, we need to keep things in perspective. Yes, this was the most important election...until 2028. No matter who the citizens of the United States have elected as president, Jesus Christ is still Lord of all that is visible and invisible. We must certainly participate in civil life on earth. However, our lasting citizenship is in heaven, where we are the elect. (Philippians 3:20)

Lastly, whoever is elected president will not take our crosses away. To be a disciple of Jesus means denying ourselves, taking up our cross each day and following the Lord. Our lives are filled with both blessings and sacrifices. In all of these things, we give thanks, for this is the will of God for us in Ghrist Jesus. (see 1 Thessalonians G18)

Regarding life at St. Julie Parish: I am in recruiting mode. We need altar servers. I am opening this up to the parish at large. I am first approaching the students in the St. Julie PSR program, grades 5 through 8. However, I am also appealing to adults and even families who would like to serve as a family. Forms will be passed out during PSR today and are available in the vestibule of the church. Server training will take place on Saturday, November 23 at 10:30 p.m. at St. Julie Parish.

From I Kings 18, a nameless widow stepped out in faith and gave Elijah some bread only to be blessed with food for a year for Elijah, her son and herself. Our gospel reading focuses on a widow whose small donation outweighed the large donations of the wealthy. In Jesus' eyes, personal sacrifice counts more than gift size.

May God give us the grace to step out of our comfort zone bless the church and those in need, trusting that God will reward our faith.




