

Dear Parishioners,

And secondly, we can take the inspiration that Danny planted in us through his music and sing our hearts out to the Lord as we continue to gather for the celebration of the Eucharist week by week.

In our gospel reading, Jesus is giving instructions to his disciples as he sends them on a mission. This is a new adventure for them. Up until this point they have been absorbing the teachings of Jesus their Master. They have been witnessing to his power to heal and liberate people. They have spent days with Jesus, watching him welcome sinners and proclaim the Kingdom of God.

Now it would be their turn. They have been tasked with proclaiming God's Kingdom. They have been given authority to cast out demons, heal the sick and even to raise the dead. These "disciples become apostles" would be sent out by the Master on their own to do his works.

I am sure that this seemed a bit overwhelming for them at first. However, Jesus anticipated their feelings. Much of this gospel speaks about how to manage fear. "Fear no one...do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul...so do not be afraid. You are worth more than many sparrows." Jesus told them that other people could not really harm them. They needed to courageously proclaim the good news in deed and word whether they were accepted or rejected. Jesus assured them that if they acknowledged him before other people, he would acknowledge them before his heavenly Father. And if they denied Jesus before others, He would deny them before the Father. (Jesus can even forgive this-remember our repentant patron, St. Peter!)

Jesus did remind them to fear the One who could destroy body and soul in Gehenna. (This was a smoldering dump outside of Jerusalem that became an image of hell.) We do need to fear God. This does not mean that we cower from God or withdraw from the Father in a servile manner. It does mean that our profound respect for God impels us to fulfill his commands and do his will. We must never presume on God's mercy. As St. Paul reminds us, "...the kindness of God...lead(s) you to repentance." (Romans 2:4)







Chairman's Statement on Dobbs Anniversary USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities

June 24, 2023, marks the one-year anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, and we have much to celebrate. By the grace of God, the nearly fiftyyear reign of national abortion on demand has been put to an end. *Roe v. Wade*—a seemingly insurmountable blight on our nation—is no more! This is a day for continued joy and for gratitude; a day to recall the countless faithful laborers who have dedicated themselves to prayer, action, witness, and service in support of the cause of life; and a day to thank God for His unending faithfulness.

Even as we celebrate, we are reminded that this is not the *end*, but the *beginning* of a critical new phase in our efforts to protect human life. Despite this momentous legal victory, sobering and varied challenges lie ahead of us. Over the past year, while some states have acted to protect preborn children, others have tragically moved to enshrine abortion in law—enacting extreme abortion policies that leave children vulnerable to abortion, even until the moment of birth.

In this shifting political landscape, we persist confidently in our efforts to defend life. The work that lies ahead continues to be not just changing laws but also helping to change hearts, with steadfast faith in the power of God to do so. The task before us begins with our knowledge of the truth and our courage to *speak* it and to *live* it with compassion.

Each of us is called to radical solidarity with women facing an unexpected or challenging

pregnancy. That means doing whatever we can to provide them with the care and support they need to welcome their children. I thank the millions of individual Catholics who are already personally living out this Gospel call through parish and community initiatives like <u>Walking with Moms in</u> <u>Need</u>.

We must likewise extend a compassionate hand to all who are suffering in the aftermath of participation in abortion. The Church continues to share Christ's healing and infinite mercy with women and men through diocesan <u>Project Rachel</u> <u>Ministries</u>.

As we each consider how we are uniquely called to build a culture of life, I invite you to join a growing community of Catholics who have subscribed to Respect Life Prayer and Action. When you sign up, you will receive prayers, alerts to contact Congress and government leaders on important legislation, and ways to strengthen a culture of life in your community. May all people of faith and good will work together to proclaim that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence.
