Dear Parishioners,

Last Saturday I witnessed the marriage of Vincent Pizzuli and Samantha Zezena. The last name of Sam's grandmother is Mazzeo. I have never had a wedding in which the last names for three generations contained two Zs. God willing, Vince and Sam will continue this into the fourth generation with their children. I did absolve Vince and Sam from mandating that their children marry into a family with the last name that had two Zs. And in case you are wondering, they did not serve pizza at the reception.

Seriously, it was great to have a young couple get married in the Church. The Catholic Church sees marriage as more than a social institution or a cultural relationship that some people prefer. Marriage is a call from God, a vocation. And to embrace that call means entering into a covenant with a member of the opposite sex for life, open to having children and being faithful to their partner. God meets this couple in Church with a special sacrament that equips them to live this state in life in a loving, sacrificial and joyful way.

One of the great changes of western culture over the last 70 years is seen in marriage. In 1950 about 3.9% of children were born outside of marriage. In 2023 the number had risen to 39.8% of children were born outside of marriage. These children lack the role models of both a father and mother. These situations lead to a less stable home, making it harder for children to succeed in school and in life.

There is no simple solution to these kinds of social problems. However, the Church is to be a part of the solution. By calling people to embrace marriage as a vocation with a mission, not simply a relationship of convenience, marriage can become a springboard to more successful lives.

And as I have written before, for couples who have gotten married outside the Church, I encourage them to investigate getting their union blessed by the Church and receive the Sacrament of Marriage. The solution to our social problems will be resolved one couple, one family at a time. Receive God's grace and be part of the solution.

Last Tuesday, as I was scurrying across the parking lot to my 4:00 p.m. Adoration Hour I saw Fr. Isidore getting dropped off. He has returned from this four week visit with his family in Tanzania. We welcome him back to North Ridgeville. Praise God for safe travels!

This week's bulletin contains an insert by Bishop Michael F. Burbidge, who heads up the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities. His timely statement at the beginning of Respect Life Month (October), helps us both embrace the dignity of each and every person, born and unborn, as well as pray. This mindset as well as prayer is what our nation needs at this time.

Many people have asked me about the upcoming presidential election. They are uncomfortable with both candidates running for the office of president. One suggestion I have is to check out the American Solidarity Party. Its platform lines up with Catholic values. Their presidential and vice-presidential candidates are on the ballot in the State of Ohio.

Some people might say, "The person has no chance to win!" I wouldn't disagree. However, a vote for a third-party candidate makes a statement. People want something beyond political ideologies that cause division and anger. Let us continue to invoke Our Lady, the Immaculate Conception, for our nation.

Final word: last week I authorized some outside work to be done at St. Julie Church and Rectory. We hired CMN Painting to paint the exterior of the church. Hopefully, this will be completed by the end of October. The rectory will be getting some new shrubbery and a new tree (replacing the dying crab apple tree near the office entry door.) God, grant us favorable weather to finish our outdoor work!

RESPECT LIFE MONTH STATEMENT

October 2024

We are living in an exciting time of revival. Our National Eucharistic Congress, and the Eucharistic processions that led to it, involved hundreds of thousands of Catholics who will never be the same. The revival continues, and is so needed, especially in our efforts to defend human life.

Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist, gives us the fullness of life. He calls each of us to respect that gift of life in every human person. While we live in a society that often rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable, they are the most in need of our care and protection. Pope Francis reminds us that “every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ, bears the face of the Lord, who even before he was born, and then just after birth, experienced the world’s rejection.”¹

The law and millions of our brothers and sisters have yet to recognize this reality. We thankfully no longer live under the regime of *Roe v. Wade*, and our elected officials are now empowered to reduce or end abortion. But what we now see is that fifty years of virtually unlimited abortion has tragically created a national mindset where many Americans have become comfortable with *some* amount of abortion. This allows the abortion industry to continue to provide *any* amount of abortion. Given this challenge, the U.S. bishops have affirmed that, while it is important to address all the ways in which human life is threatened, “abortion remains our pre-eminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone.”²

In a tragic way, abortion has become the pre-eminent priority for others as well. We see many politicians celebrating the destruction of preborn children, and protecting access to abortion, even up until the moment of birth. Few leaders are standing up to limit the harm of chemical abortion (abortion pills) to mothers and children, which is now the most common form of abortion. And heading into the November elections, as many as ten states face gravely evil ballot initiatives that would enshrine abortion in their state constitutions.

Pope St. John Paul II’s words resonate today: “we are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the ‘culture of death’ and the ‘culture of life’ ... we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life.”³

And so we need a revival of prayer and action:

- We must renew our commitment to work for the legal protection of every human life, from conception to natural death, and to vote for candidates who will defend the life and dignity of the human person.

- We must call for policies that assist women and their children in need, while also continuing to help mothers in our own communities through local pregnancy help centers and our nationwide, parish-based initiative, [Walking with Moms in Need](#).
- We must likewise continue to extend the hand of compassion to all who are suffering from participation in abortion, through the Church's abortion healing ministries like [Project Rachel Ministry](#).
- Most importantly, we must rededicate ourselves to fervent prayer on behalf of life.

I invite all Catholics to join me in a concerted effort of prayer between now and our national elections, by daily praying our Respect Life Month "Prayer for Life to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament":

Jesus, you came that we might have life—and have it in abundance. Together with the Father and the Holy Spirit, you form us in our mothers' wombs and call us to love you for all eternity. As your most precious gift of human life is attacked, draw us ever closer to your Real Presence in the Eucharist. Dispel the darkness of the culture of death, for you are the light that shines in the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it. By the power of your Eucharistic Presence, help us to defend the life of every human person at every stage. Transform our hearts to protect and cherish all whose lives are most vulnerable. For you are God, forever and ever. Amen.



Through the graces of this revival, may we witness, work, and vote so that all children in the womb will be protected in law and welcomed in love, and that all mothers and families will be strengthened by our support and accompaniment.
