


PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Dear Parishioners,

We arrived home from the National Eucharistic Congress last Sunday evening. These were five of the most exhilarating, exhausting, and inspirational days of my life. 60,000 people participated in this historic event. It took place at Lucas Oil Stadium and the adjoining Indiana Convention Center in downtown Indianapolis. Catholics from near and far came to learn, be empowered, and then commissioned to bring the good news of the presence of Jesus Christ among us in the Blessed Sacrament.

The Diocese of Cleveland was well represented. There were four or five busloads of participants as well as a bevy of individual carloads from our diocese. Bishop Malesic and Bishop Woost were also in attendance as well as around 10 priests.

Mass was the first thing on the morning agenda. Most Masses were about two hours in length. It takes time for a thousand priests and bishops to process in. Distributing Holy Communion to 25,000 to 30,000 thousand people also took a bit of time. Besides the main Mass, simultaneous Masses were celebrated in other venues in Spanish and for the youth. Evenings were also spent in Lucas Oil Stadium. There were plenty of inspirational talks, amazing music (contemporary songs, traditional hymns, and Latin chants) and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Workshops at the Indiana Convention Center began at 10:45 a.m. and went intermittently through the late afternoon. Confessions were heard morning, noon, and evening. I was privileged to go to confession as well as hear confessions during the Congress.

Needless to say, the whole event truly revived and refreshed the faith of thousands of Catholics. Our mission is to Go! We cannot keep the Good News to ourselves. As Chris Stefanik said, "Go is two thirds of God's name!"

I am grateful to the Eucharistic Apostles of St. Peter and St. Julie Parish. We held two home visiting training sessions last week. We will be holding two more sessions this upcoming week. If you have not yet signed up to be an ambassador for our parish in the Lord's name, please check out the bulletin and join our team. You will be a blessing to our community and will be blessed yourself!

This coming Saturday, August 3, Alex Kostritsa, the Music Director of St. Peter Parish, will be in concert at the St. Peter gym. Admission is free and the music will be uplifting. The time is 7:00 p.m. and all are welcome!

This week's gospel is a detour from the Gospel of Mark. We will be spending five weeks in a row looking at John 6. This gospel is very timely given that we are in a season of Eucharistic revival for the United States.

This first Sunday's gospel from John 6:1-15 is the most frequently referred to miracle of Jesus in the New Testament: the multiplication of the loaves and fish. It appears six times in the four gospels (twice each in Matthew and Mark and once each in Luke and John). This miracle speaks to us on many levels. It reveals both Jesus' power over nature and his compassion for people. It also points to the miracle that Jesus has left us by which we remember his saving death and glorious resurrection: the Eucharist.

As we journey through this chapter, we will hear Jesus tell us that we should be seeking the bread that sustains us unto eternal life and not merely the bread that sustains our earthly existence. He will then remind us that He Himself is the Bread of Life. And that this bread is His Flesh given for the life of the world. In fact, Jesus will say that unless we eat His flesh and drink His blood, we do not have life in us. The final section of John 6 describes the response of his disciples. Many walked away, but the twelve remained firm in the faith in Jesus.

I pray that as we continue through this year of focusing on the celebrating of Mass and the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, that we would become a more faithful Catholic people, devoutly worshipping the Lord. Strengthened by Him, we will make Him known in deed and word.

Ukraine Welcome Circle Updates

It is hard to believe that we are only 6 months into our journey with the Bryiovskyis. We have achieved a lot together.

The boys finished the school term June 21st and went to a church camp for a week. Daniel, Artur and Suisanna are all enjoying all the sports for which you have so generously provided equipment. One of the favorite pastimes for the whole family is swimming. Another donation allowed them to get a family pass to all the public pools in Parma. They take advantage of that as often as they can.

Both Vitalii and Nadiia now have their Ohio Driver licenses! They still have the use a car from Vitalii's brother, but Vitalii took a big step this past month. Using his pay from his job at the logistics company and with some help from his boss, he was able to buy a car from a salvage yard. The car needs a lot of work but, since Vitalii was a mechanic in Ukraine, he will be able to make the repairs himself over the next months.

We are very happy that he took this initiative to plan ahead for when his brother will need his car back.

We continue to explore the options to get Vitalii a CDL license to allow him to get a position that not only allows him to use his mechanical skills, but also opens the option of truck driving. This process has been more challenging than anticipated.

We are also exploring ideas with Nadiia to use her sewing skills to help support the family needs.

This past week, we had a couple of challenges at the house because the A/C went out and then there was a backup in the basement from the storm sewer. Our landlord was very responsive to both issues. We made a great team with the family doing a lot of "bailing" until the plumber could get there. The only "casualty" was an area rug in the basement. We are hoping a good cleaning will resolve that.

It is hard to explain how grateful the family is for all the help we have given. We are truly a team giving "A Hand Up and Not a Hand Out."
